General Rules & Information

1. Canyon County Fair Management reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and to resolve all matters, questions, and disputes arising from or connected with the Fair. Exhibitors failing to comply with these rules may be subject to premium forfeiture.
2. Disrespect shown to any judge or Fair official will result in forfeiture of all awards and removal from the Fairgrounds.
3. Refer to the specific department for additional rules.
4. The owner or custodian of property of any kind brought to the Fairgrounds whether for exhibit or for other purposes assumes, as a condition of its admission to the Fairgrounds, all risk of and responsibility for loss, damage, or theft. Exhibitor exempts the Canyon County Fair, its officers, directors and employees from liability for any loss, damage, or injury to any person or the property of any person or any animal owned or exhibited by the exhibitor and shall indemnify the Canyon County Fair against all claims arising from the exhibitor's actions or negligence.

ELIGIBILITY

5. Entries are open to anyone.
6. Exhibits previously shown at the Canyon County Fair will not be accepted.
7. Most departments include Youth Division classes. If no appropriate youth class is available, youth exhibitors may enter the Adult Divisions unless otherwise specified in department rules.

ENTRY DEADLINES - Refer to the schedule on the previous page or within each department for entry deadlines. Pre-entry is highly encouraged; however, entries may also be made on site at the time exhibits are delivered.

9. Exhibitor must use one entry form for each department entered.
10. EXHIBITOR MAY SUBMIT ONLY ONE ENTRY PER CLASS.

PLACEMENT OF EXHIBITS

11. See special rules in each department for date and time when exhibits are accepted. **Exhibits must be delivered to The Center, 110 County Fair Avenue, Caldwell, ID 83605.**

12. All exhibits must bear the entry tag given by the clerk at the time of entry.
13. Department Superintendents are authorized to accept entries for display purposes only if there is space and if they deem the exhibit to be worthy.
14. All exhibits are subject to the control of the Department Superintendent.
15. Select exhibits will be moved frequently. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to secure any loose or unsupported components of their exhibit to a solid foundation, as well as to ensure the exhibit is ready for final display at the time of drop off.

JUDGING

15. Open Class judges will be selected and approved by the Canyon County Fair prior to the Fair.
16. Judges may withhold any award if, in their opinion, the exhibit does not merit placing.
17. Exhibitors may not communicate with judges regarding entries. Infraction of this rule will cause disqualification of exhibits entered.
18. Judges needing information will call upon the Department Superintendent.
19. In all cases, the decision of the judge is final.

RELEASE OF EXHIBITS

20. **Entries will be released on Monday, July 27 from 2:00 - 7:00 p.m. in The Center.** Exhibits will not be released before the designated check out time.
21. Exhibits not claimed within ten (10) days after the close of the Fair may be disposed of at the discretion of Fair Management.

AWARDS & PREMIUMS

22. First, second, and third place ribbons will be given to exhibits in each class based on merit. The following premiums will be paid:

Blue Ribbon	1st Place	\$5.00
Red Ribbon	2nd Place	\$4.00
White Ribbon	3rd Place	\$3.00
23. Cash premiums can be picked up Monday, July 27 from 2:00 - 7:00 p.m. in The Center. Premium monies not picked up within ten (10) days of the close of the Canyon County Fair will be reverted to the Fair.

PROTESTS

24. All protests must be in writing and be accompanied by a \$250 deposit which is forfeited if protest is not sustained by Fair Management. Protest must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal and must be delivered to Fair Management immediately after the occasion that prompted the protest. Protests will be accepted prior to, during, and within two (2) hours immediately following the occasion that prompted the protest.
25. Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigation. Depending on the basis of the protest, a decision may be withheld until a complete investigation has been conducted.

1. General rules and regulations apply in this department.
2. For entry instructions, refer to the [General Information](#) section of the Competitive Exhibitor Guide.
3. **EXHIBITOR MAY SUBMIT ONLY ONE ENTRY PER CLASS.**
4. Label all exhibits with the exhibitor’s name, address, phone number, division, and class. Labels must be placed on the back of the artwork in the upper right-hand corner. Address labels are acceptable.
5. No artwork larger than **24” x 36”** (watercolor paper size) will be accepted.
6. Exhibits (unless on stretched canvas) must be suitably framed and securely fastened with appropriate hardware. Taped artwork will not be accepted. Exhibits on stretched canvas are not required to be framed; however, canvas edges must be painted.
7. All exhibits must have wire securely attached and be ready for hanging, with no more than 2” between the wire and the top of the frame. Exhibits will not be accepted if tabs, tape, glue, or sawtooth hangers are the sole means of support.
8. Youth Exception: Youth entries may be submitted without frames if the work is neat, finished, and suitable for hanging. Tape and glue are not permitted. Drawings must be completed on art paper (no lined tablet paper). Matting is recommended.
9. All paintings must be completely dry.
10. Classroom Division is intended for beginning artists. Classroom work is defined as artwork created in an instructional setting where a teacher or demonstrator is present.
11. All work, except Classroom Division entries, must be original. Copied or traced work will not be accepted.
12. While reasonable care will be taken, the Fair assumes no responsibility for loss, damage, or theft.

13. Any work requiring special props for display is the responsibility of the entrant.
14. The Department Superintendent reserves the right to reject any exhibit deemed objectionable, requiring excessive space, or submitted after capacity has been reached. Entries must not exceed 50 lbs.
15. Professional Division is open to artists who create work with the intent to sell or who teach art.

3. **EXHIBITOR MAY SUBMIT ONLY ONE ENTRY PER CLASS.**
4. All articles must be the handwork of the exhibitor and must be freshly baked.
5. All exhibits must be placed in a sealed, clean, unmarked, plastic bag and displayed on a sturdy paper plate or foil-covered cardboard.
6. All exhibits must be labeled with exhibitor name, address, phone number, division, and class.
7. All products must be made from scratch. Mixes are not permitted.
8. Plastic coverings will be removed after judging for display purposes.

BREADS

Special Rules

- Each entry must consist of one loaf of bread or four rolls, muffins, scones, or biscuits. Loaf size is not considered in judging.

CAKES

Special Rules

- Cakes must be displayed on covered cardboard or paper plates and appropriately covered.
- Iced cakes will be judged equally on cake and icing. Cakes must be iced unless otherwise specified.
- Each entry must consist of either half a cake or four cupcakes.

COOKIES

Special Rules

- Four cookies displayed on a white paper plate and enclosed in a plastic bag.

CANDY

Special Rules

- Each entry must include six pieces, cut into approximately 1" x 1" squares, displayed on a covered plate and enclosed in a plastic bag.
- Boxed icing candies are not permitted.
- Entries must follow a standard recipe.

DECORATED CAKE AND CUPCAKE CONTEST

Special Rules

1. Exhibits received Monday, July 20 from 3:00 - 7:00 p.m. in The Center.
2. Cakes will be judged on visual presentation only and will not be cut. Cakes need not be edible. Styrofoam cake forms are encouraged.
3. Cakes should be displayed on a commercial or handmade presentation board with dimensions measuring between two and four inches larger than the cake.
4. No plastic decorations allowed.

Judging will be based on the following criteria:

- **Appearance** - Balance, color harmony, consistency of pattern
- **Artistic Quality** - Originality, difficulty of techniques, overall visual appeal
- **Neatness** - Texture of icing, uniformity of repeat pattern

3. **EXHIBITOR MAY SUBMIT ONLY ONE ENTRY PER CLASS.**
4. Judging will be based on:
 - a. Processing method and processing time
 - b. Color, clarity & uniformity of product
 - c. Cleanliness of jar and ring (no rusty rings)
5. Judges reserve the right to open any jar.
6. All products must be exhibited in standard canning jars (e.g, Ball, Kerr). Mayonnaise or non-standard jars are not permitted. Zinc lids are prohibited.
7. All canned foods must have been processed within the past 12 months and sealed in standard canning jars. Paraffin seals are not permitted.
8. Freezer jam and open-kettle products are not permitted.
9. Jars must be labeled with contents and processing method (boiling water or pressure canner), including processing times, pressure (if applicable), date, and elevation. **Note:** Salsa entries must include the recipe.
10. Up-to-date canning information is available through the Canyon County Extension Office.
11. Fruits, meat, vegetables, and juices shall be exhibited in pint or quart jars. Corn must be exhibited in pint jars only. Jams, jellies, and pickles shall be exhibited in pint or half-pint jars. If smaller jars (e.g. ¼-pint) are used, they must follow the processing time of the next larger tested size.
12. Required headspace: ¼ inch for jams and jellies, ¼ inch for tomatoes, fruits, and pickles, ¼ to 1 inch for vegetables, 1 to 1 ¼ inch for meats.
13. Dried items must be exhibited in pint or half-pint jars and labeled on the bottom with product type, month and year dried, drying method, approximate drying time, and any additives. The jars must be labeled on the bottom, as to kind, month, and year dried (July 2025 to July 2026), method used for drying, approximate drying time and any additives or color enhancers. Fruit rolls should be sealed in a clear plastic bag.
14. All canned exhibits must be processed according to USDA/National Center for Home Food Preservation guidelines for safe home canning. Judging will be based upon USDA standards and/or Ball Blue Book Standards.

- **Beginner** - New to photography with limited experience or training. Photographs must be between 8" x 10" and 11" x 14".
- **Amateur** - A hobbyist growing in skill and experience. Photographs must be between 8" x 10" and 11" x 14".

- **Professional** - Anyone who currently charges or has charged for photography services, sells work in a gallery, has been published, or teaches photography. Photographs must be 11" x 14" or larger. Business cards may be attached after judging.
- **Youth** - Exhibitors 17 years old or younger. Class determines entry options. Photographs must be between 8" x 10" and 11" x 14".

CLASS DEFINITIONS

- **Abstract** - Lines, geometric forms, shapes, and patterns that are enhanced, but not manipulated. Enhanced means changes in color, tones, or ordinary darkroom techniques where elements have not been removed or added.
- **Architectural** - Images should consist of buildings, bridges, man-made structures, etc. The structure should be the main component and focus of the photograph.
- **Creative** - Utilizes methods which alter the appearance of the image so that it is substantially different from the way it would normally appear to the human eye. Some of the methods include multiple exposures, adding color to black and white images, adding textures and patterns.
- **Cultural** - Documents the activities, structures, ceremony, work and play that are unique to specific groups of people.
- **Farm Scenes** - Things you would find on a farm.
- **Human Interest** - Should include actions of animals or people.
- **Idaho** - Promoting Idaho tourism, commerce, recreation, etc.
- **Landscapes** - Any type of landscape that does not have any man-made objects in the photograph.
- **Reflections** - Anything that reflects an image as its main focus - water, metal, mirrors, etc.
- **Scenic** - Any type of landscape that includes a man-made object (structures, fences, cars, etc.)
- **Still Life** - Photographs of arranged inanimate objects where the photographer is in control of the direction of light, light ratio, shadow edge definition, relationships of objects to each other and viewpoint.
- **Transportation** - Planes, trains, and automobiles.
